### Is your 4-year-old joining our Reception Class in September 2025?

If your child (currently in our Nursery) has been allocated a place in our Reception Class for September, you should now have been informed. We are delighted that his/her journey will be continuing at The Grange. Before any child can start, her/his parents/carers <u>MUST</u> have attended a new intake meeting. Two meetings have already taken place and there will be a third and final meeting at 5.00 p.m. on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> June. New starters must take part in the various integration activities that will be explained at the meeting. Even if you have older children at the school and think that you know our procedures well, your participation in the new intake process is crucial. Children will not be permitted to start Reception unless and until all our integration programme has been undertaken.

### Breakfast Club

I am delighted to announce that we have taken possession of more Breakfast Club resources for children attending to enjoy. These include some activities to encourage more active play under the canopy by the Nursery entrance. This new equipment will be used on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

You are reminded that Breakfast Club starts at 8.00 a.m. Children should not arrive in school before 8.00 a.m. as there are no staff on duty to supervise them. Breakfast is served up to 8.25 a.m.

At 8.35 a.m. children make their way to class.

Apart from Breakfast Club staff, the only adults in the hall in the mornings should be the Passenger Assistants and drivers of mini-buses and taxis who bring children in Classes Seven - Twelve. Obviously, in some cases, parents/carers of these children are their assigned supervisors and they may, of course, remain in the hall with them.

Would you like your child to attend our Nursery? - Parents/carers of children who have their third birthday before  $31^{st}$  March 2026 may now apply for a Nursery place. Application forms are available from the main school office.

Nursery Leavers' Graduation - The Nursery Graduation on Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> July is only for those children who will be leaving our Nursery at the end of this term.

Nursery - end of term - As always, Nursery term ends on the day before the final day for the rest of the school. This is to enable Nursery staff to hold an induction day for new Nursery starters. Nursery term ends on Thursday  $17^{th}$  July.





Dear parents,

Places are now available to join a new 12-week football course every Wednesday at King's Leadership Academy, which is open to both boys and girls.

Our courses teach children correct football techniques by FA qualified coaches who have full DBS (CRB) clearance to work with children. The structure for the course is 'FUN through Football,' building confidence for total beginners and moving onto more complex sessions for experienced players.

We provide a ball per player for the majority of our drills ensuring children get more touches of the ball and improve quicker than conventional coaching where children are waiting around to have a turn. The sessions are held in the fantastic sports hall so trainers should be worn. Players are also advised to bring a still drink for the session.

The club has links to local junior teams of which players will be able to play for at the weekend. Players who show advanced ability on the course will be recommended for trials at professional academies. Players who have previously attended courses are currently playing for Preston North End, Blackburn Rovers, Manchester United, Liverpool, Blackpool, Everton, Burnley, Bolton, Oldham, Rochdale and Wigan.

The cost of the course is just £6.25 per week, which is payable in two instalments. The first payment of £25 is due when booking your child on and the second payment of £50 due at the first session. Parents are encouraged to watch the sessions but are welcome to leave children, as every session is fully supervised.

### \*\*NEW TOURNAMENT FORMAT\*\*

Every four weeks we have a tournament in order for the children to put their new-found skills into practice with medals awarded at the end of the course for various categories.

ALL PLAYERS WILL RECEIVE A TROPHY AND MEDAL at the presentation, which is held on the final week of the course. Additional trophies will also be awarded in each group from categories including; Best Attitude, Star Player, Most Improved Player, Most Promising Player and Hardest Working Player.
