Curriculum Overview

In Class 2 we study these topics:

'Where In The World Are We?'

This is a geography based study that begins in Liverpool, then Australia, the poles and then finally the equator.

'Rule Britannia'

This is a history based topic that includes the study of The Great Fire Of London, our royal family and castles. We hope to include another trip to Clitheroe Castle at the end of this topic.


<u>'Out Of This World'</u>

This is a history based topic that includes the study of Neil Armstrong, the moon landing and Tim Peake.

To support your child's learning at home please encourage them to carry out their own research using books or the Internet. A more detailed outline of topic coverage will be posted on our class page of our website each term (www.thegrangeprimary.com).

Phonics - RWI

- Read Write Inc includes rhymes and flashcards for each sound.
- The children complete daily phonics lessons to support their reading and writing skills.
- In Year One children take part in the phonics screening test which assesses the children's reading. Children may be practising some nonsense words to help them with their blending.





Reading

The children will bring home three different books.

- In our school, children read Read Write Inc. Storybooks that match the sounds they can read.
- Two new decodable reading books are sent home every week.
- In some cases, children may bring home phonics flash cards or worksheets instead.
- A book from the library which is of specific interest to the child will also be sent.
 This book will need to be read by an adult. Or an ORT book from our classroom
 library which will be in line with their decodable books.

The decodable books will be changed once a week in line with the school phonics programme.

Homework

For this academic year, the homework requirement will be as follows:

Reading

Every day (reading records should be signed by an adult)

Virtual Phonics Lesson

A link to a virtual lesson will be sent. This lesson will mirror their phonics lessons in school.

Common Exception Words (CEW)

In your child's Reading Record book there are Year 1 and Year 2 CEW, please help your child to read and spell these words.

From time to time teachers may set other homework tasks.

Reading, spelling and TT Rockstar homework is sent home so that children's learning can be consolidated at home. Sometimes when children are regularly not completing tasks at home teachers may choose complete these tasks with children during morning break time or lunchtime.

Attendance & Punctuality

- Holidays should not be booked during term time
- Arrival time for all classes is 8.35 a.m. children must be in class at 8.45 a.m. when the register is taken.
- Children can attend breakfast club from 8.00 a.m. in the hall. Breakfast items can be purchased from the counter.
- If your child is unable to attend school, due to illness, please telephone the school office.
- If you haven't contacted school our Home-School Liaison Officer will contact you.
- If your child has an appointment (medical or other) could you please send a letter or appointment card into school with the details.
- A variety of attendance awards are given to classes and individuals with the best attendance.

<u>Uniform</u>

- Please ensure your child is always dressed for school in the correct school uniform.
- Could you also ensure that all uniform and belongings are labelled with your child's name.
- Trainers are NOT allowed to be worn for school.
- Jewellery (apart from watches and small spherical stud earnings) may not be worn.
- Children with long hair should wear it tied back. Please avoid large brightly coloured bows and hair accessories.
- Please ensure haircuts are appropriate for school.
- Nail varnish should not be worn in school.
- Children should use our school book bags or bags of a similar size.
- Due to limited space, larger satchel / handbags style bags are not allowed.

P.E. and Water Bottles

- P.E. is on a Monday and Tuesday each week. Please ensure that your child has the correct kit in school (red t-shirt, black shorts/black jogging bottoms and black pumps/trainers).
- We expect the children to attempt dressing themselves for P.E.
 Please encourage your child to practise their dressing skills at
 home if this is something they find tricky. We will support the
 children with this in class. P.E. kits are sent home to be washed at
 the end of each half term.
- Please ensure your child brings a bottle of water into school every day labelled with their name.

<u>Book Bags</u>

Please ensure that you check your child's book bag every day as important letters or information may be found.

Fire Drill and Lockdown Procedures

- For health and safety reasons, every year we have a number of fire drills to ensure that our procedures are as efficient as they can be should the school ever have to deal with a real emergency situation
- A lockdown drill will take place during the year and all children will be informed in an assembly prior to the drill. This should help to ensure that no children become distressed during the exercise.

Relationships and Health Education

We now deliver Health and Relationships lessons using Discovery Education's Health and Relationships curriculum. The curriculum covers the statutory requirements for teaching primary Health Education and Relationships Education. It contains lessons for teaching all aspects of the guidelines and the non-statutory aspects of Primary Sex Education at an age appropriate level.

Parents have the right to request that their child be withdrawn from Sex Education lessons delivered as part of statutory Relationships and Health Education.

ParentPay

Payment for all school activities e.g. lunches, trips and visits etc. needs to be made using ParentPay.

We do not accept cash payments. Please be sure to activate your ParentPay account (details from the school office)

Letters with a Permission Slip

Some letters are sent home with a permission slip attached that needs to be sent back to school. Please only send the permission slip back to school and retain the important information on the letter for future reference. This will help to avoid unnecessary telephone calls to the school office.
