## Secondary School applications



You should have received a letter detailing the process of applying for your child's secondary school place.

This process will need to be completed **online**; the website is on the letter.

The deadline for applications is **Friday 31**st **October 2025**.



#### Key Stage 2 Tests



The Key Stage 2 National Tests will take place during **Monday** 11<sup>th</sup> May – Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> May 2026.

Children will be tested on their **English** (reading & SPaG) and **Mathematics** (arithmetic and reasoning).

During the Spring term, children will receive a revision resource pack from school to help them with their studies.



#### Key Stage 2 Tests



An 'Achievement School' will take place during the Spring. There will also be Saturday morning sessions leading up towards the tests:

Monday 30<sup>th</sup> March 2026 9am-12pm

Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> March 2026 9am-12pm

Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> April 2026 9am-12pm

Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2026 9am-12pm



#### Key Stage 2 Tests



SATs are crucial for helping secondary schools predict future academic performance and setting appropriate target grades across subjects.

This process ties directly into secondary school performance measures via Progress 8 scores, which assess schools based on whether students meet, exceed, or underperform against predicted scores derived from their SATs results.



#### Year 6 Residential

#### Homework



In Class 6 the homework requirement will be as follows:

**Reading** – Each school night (reading records must be signed by an adult)

**Spelling** – New spellings will be given on a Thursday and tested the following Thursday.

**Times Tables** – Minimum of 15 minutes during the week on TT Rockstars (children who cannot access TT Rockstars at home will be given a paper based activity).

Homework is sent home so that children's learning can be consolidated at home. Sometimes when children are regularly not completing tasks at home, teachers may choose complete these tasks with children during morning break time or lunchtime.



## Reading



Throughout the week your child will bring home reading books from our levelled school reading scheme.

They will also bring home a reading record book which contains vital information about the ways that you can support your child's reading development.

We require you to read with your child each school night and maintain a dialogue with us through this book.

A written comment about your child's reading should be made daily. These may include the questions you asked them to check their understanding or how fluently they read.

## Reading



A growing number of studies show that promoting reading can have a major impact on children and adults and their future. Upon reviewing the research literature, Clark and Rumbold (2006) identify several main areas of the benefits to reading for pleasure:

- Reading attainment and writing ability;
- Text comprehension and grammar;
- Breadth of vocabulary;
- Positive reading attitudes;
- Greater self-confidence as a reader;
- Pleasure in reading in later life;
- General knowledge;
- A better understanding of other cultures;
- · Community participation; and
- A greater insight into human nature and decision-making.







PE in Class 6 is on Tuesday (outdoors – weather dependent) and Thursday (swimming).

#### **School PE Kit**

Your child should wear black shorts, a red Grange t-shirt and black pumps (indoor) or trainers (outdoor).

#### **Swimming Kit**

A 1 piece swimming costume or tight trunks, a swimming hat, a towel and/or goggles.

It is vital for your child's health and development that they take part fully in P.E. lessons. Therefore, if your child presents without a kit, we will contact you to try to arrange for a kit to be brought into school.

Could you please ensure that all P.E. kit is labelled also.



#### **Attendance and Punctuality**



#### Holidays should not be booked during term time

Arrival time for all classes is 8.35 a.m. Children must be in class at 8.45 a.m. when the register is taken.

Children may attend breakfast club from 8.00 a.m. in the hall. Breakfast items can be purchased from the counter.

If your child is unable to attend school, due to illness, please telephone the school office.

If you haven't contacted school our Home-School Liaison Officer will contact you.

If your child has an appointment (medical or other) could you please send a letter or appointment card into school with the details.

A variety of attendance awards are given to classes and individuals with the best attendance.



## Uniform



Please ensure your child is always dressed for school in the correct school uniform.

Could you also ensure that all uniform and belongings are labelled with your child's name.

All children must wear black shoes.

Jewellery (apart from watches and small studded earrings) may not be worn.

Children with long hair should wear it tied back. Please avoid large brightly coloured bows and hair accessories. Please ensure haircuts are appropriate for school.

Nail varnish/gel or acrylics should not be worn in school.

Children should use our school book bags or bags of a similar size.



## Fire Drill and Lockdown Procedures



For health and safety reasons, every year we have a number of fire drills to ensure that our procedures are as efficient as they can be should the school ever have to deal with a real emergency situation.

Children will be informed in an assembly prior to the drill. This should help to ensure that no children become distressed during the exercise.



### Snack



As your child is in Key Stage 2, snack is not provided by the school. However, your child may still be bring a snack in for break time but please note the following:

Only fruit is permitted (e.g. an apple or a banana.)

Children may bring snack bars, biscuits, cereal bars etc. in their packed lunch but please do not send sweets.

Children are encouraged to bring a named water bottle containing only still, non-flavoured water.



#### Relationships and Health Education



We now deliver Health and Relationships lessons using Discovery Education's Health and Relationships curriculum.

The curriculum covers the statutory requirements for teaching primary Health Education and Relationships Education. It contains lessons for teaching all aspects of the guidelines the non-statutory aspects of Primary Sex Education at an age-appropriate level in Year Five and Year Six.

Parents have the right to request that their child be withdrawn from Sex Education lessons delivered as part of statutory Relationships and Health Education.

## Letters with a permission slip

We continue to encourage your child as they are now in their last year of primary school to be responsible for sharing important letters with yourselves.

However, will you please ensure to check their book bags for any important information.

Payment for all school activities e.g lunches, trips and visits etc need to be made using ParentPay.

We do not accept cash payments. Please ensure you have an activated ParentPay account.
