## Applying for a Place at High School

The window for applying for a High School place in September 2026 is now open. If you have a child in Year Six, you must follow the instructions on the letter posted on our website or visit:

Parents/carers of ALL Year Six aged children MUST apply for a mainstream high school place, this includes children in Classes 8, 9, 10 and 12 who are unlikely to attend a mainstream school. We appreciate that this may appear to be an unnecessary exercise, but it remains the only way of your child being in the system to gain a place in a special school or similar.

The closing date for registering for a high school place is 31st October 2025.

Where appropriate, you can attend your consultation online via a video call.

Video calling is as convenient as a phone call, with the added value of face-to-face communication.

It can save you time and money, and brings your care closer to home.



## Where do I go to attend my appointment?



## Go to: https://nhs.vc/schoolnursesseftonmaghull

Instead of travelling to your appointment, you enter the clinic's online waiting area. The health service is notified when you arrive, and your clinician will join you when ready.

There is no need to create an account. No information you enter is stored.

- What do I need to make a video call?
- A good connection to the internet
  If you can watch a video online (e.g.
  YouTube) you can make a video call
- A private, well-lit area where you will not be disturbed during the consultation
- One of these:
  - Google Chrome web browser on a desktop or laptop, or on an Android tablet or smartphone
  - Safari web browser on an Apple iMac, MacBook, iPad, or iPhone
- Web-camera, speakers and microphone already built into laptops or mobile devices

## Is it secure?

Video calls are secure; your privacy is protected.

You have your own private video room that only authorised clinicians can enter.

## How much internet data will I use?

You don't use any data while waiting for a clinician to join you.

A video call uses a similar amount of data to Skype® or FaceTime®.

## £ How much does a video call cost?

The video call is free (except for your internet usage).


### Smartphone and tablet users

- Apple Safari MacOS 10.12+, iOS 11.4+, iPadOS 13+




